

BEGINNER1. LESSON #46. LE PETIT SAC ROUGE

- Ton petit sac rouge est sur la table.
- Je le prends.
- Ton doudou est dedans ?
- Non, il est encore dans le lit... Non, je ne le trouve pas.
- Regarde sous le lit.
- Oui, je le vois. Voilà, mon sac est prêt.
- Allons-y. Grand-mère t'attend à Sèvres et je ne veux pas être en retard au restaurant.

TRANSLATION

- Your little red bag is on the table.
- I'm taking it.
- Is your doudou inside ?
- No, it's still in the bed. No, I can't find it.
- Look under the bed.
- Yes, I see it. There it is, my bag is ready.
- Let's go. Grandma is waiting for you in Sèvres and I don't want to be late at the restaurant.



Sur : on.
Table (fém.) : table.
Dans : in.
Trouver : to find.
Sous : under.
Prêt, prête : ready.
En retard : late.



In this lesson we have **some location prepositions** : *dans* (that means *in*), *sur* (*on*) and *sous* (*under*).

You know now well French **personal pronouns** :
je, tu, il, elle, on, nous, vous, ils, elles.
These forms are the one we use when they are subjects.

Some of them change form when they are objects :

Je le prends

Je ne le trouve pas

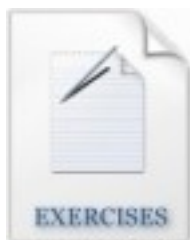
Let's learn the singular pronouns today :

<i>Je</i>	<i>Me</i>	<i>Elle me regarde.</i>	She looks at me.
<i>Tu</i>	<i>Te</i>	<i>Elle te regarde.</i>	She looks at you.
<i>Il</i>	<i>Le</i>	<i>Elle le regarde.</i>	She looks at him / it
<i>Elle</i>	<i>La</i>	<i>Elle la regarde.</i>	She looks at her

Attention !

- Notice that these pronouns are placed between the subject and the verb.
- *Me, te, le* or *la* may become *m', t'* or *l'* when they are before a verb that begins with a vowel or an unpronounced *h*.

Grand-mère t'attend.



Translate in French :

1. Your child is waiting.
2. I take him.
3. Grandma is waiting.
4. We can see her.

Translate in English :

1. Ton gros sac bleu est sous la table.
2. Je le vois.
3. Tes bonbons roses sont dans la boîte.
4. Je la prends.

Boîte (fém.) : box.
